A Word From Our Minister: “Virtual” Worship

A microscopic virus is wreaking havoc with people’s daily lives the world over. The virtue of “better safe than sorry” is the mode of the day... of the month, actually! Concern about contagion has mandated “stay home, stay safe” orders from Michigan’s governor, especially for folks who are older or who have compromised immune systems. Frankly, that describes many of our members.

While most of us take precautions against ordinary colds and seasonal flu — and our custodian, Mike LaMarre, comes in every day to wipe down door handles, crash-bars, elevator buttons, etc. in the Church — our Board of Directors has decided to call off worship services on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Easter Sunday.

However, those of you who have a computer at home will be able to join us for “virtual” worship — virus-free and at your convenience.



Our organist/choir director, Kat Tomaszewski, and I will record the worship services for all three of those days. She will provide the music, and we’ll print the lyrics [in this Newsletter](#), along with the responsive readings. I will preach the sermons and Lynn Borke will be the Lay Reader. Our Church Secretary, Bri Fastnaught, will up-load them to our website — uccalpena.org. They will be on our “home page” so you can view Palm Sunday on April 5, the Maundy Thursday “Lord’s Last Supper” service on April 9, and the Easter Sunday worship service on April 12. (Unfortunately, there will be no “Easter Sunrise” service at the Yacht Club this year. We will miss it.)

Easter brings new hope and new life. We may have to “stay home”, but we can “stay connected” using the internet. Let’s put some “**virtue**” into being “**virtual**” — maybe we’ll “go viral” without the virus! With God’s help, we can make it through these tough times. Even though the virus is spreading, God is with us. No difficulty is too vast for God. Spring time brings more sun, and flowers, and animal life to our community. This would be a good time to **re-vive** our relationships by phone calls/email and to **reconnect** beyond the “quarantine” and “social distancing” required by the coronavirus precautions. Call To Worship and Morning Prayer

One: Psalm 118 declares: “This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it!

All: **Save us, we beseech You, O Lord. Save us, Hosanna! Lord, save us.”**

One: The prophet Zechariah said: “Rejoice greatly, O Zion! Shout loudly, Jerusalem, for, lo, your king comes to you.

All: **Triumphant & victorious is he! Humble and riding on a donkey, is he; on a colt, a foal of a donkey.**

One: He will cut off the chariots, and the war horses from Jerusalem.

All: **The battle bow will be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations.”**

One: In the isolation of our homes, we remember Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem on that first Palm Sunday. We have no crowd around us, but may we imagine the joy of the people that day, and may we share their hope for liberation.


All: **And may we also take to heart the challenge that Jesus brought to the status quo, confronting the way things were back then and, unfortunately, in some ways, still are.**

One: Bless us, O Lord God, our Creator, in this hour of worship. We may be separated in our homes, but we are united in Thy Spirit. Let us now pray, using words Jesus taught us to say together:

All: **“Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy Will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the Kingdom, and the Power, and the Glory forever. Amen.”**
