A Word From Our Minister: Your Transitional Pastor

It was more than 50 years ago, how many I'm not sure, and I was sitting in a class listening to a professor talk about how to write and deliver a sermon. I really don't remember much about what he said, but one thing stuck in my mind. Why this one sentence I am not sure. He said: "Never start a service by saying Good Morning." You may notice that to this day I very rarely do and when I do its because I forgot this simple lesson.

You might ask why would you not start a Sunday morning service with a friendly greeting. He went on to say something like this; "You never know how many of the members of the congregation are having a terrible morning and they are there because they expect something from the church that will give them strength, comfort, courage and hope." Those are my words trying to get the essence of what he said. So how do you do start a service. I do remember that was to be left up to us to decide. How do you open a service. I came up with these words you may often hear me say "May the Peace, Grace and Love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all."

In a chaotic world filled with anger, mistrust and division there must be a place out of which peace can come. Jesus is the bringer of peace and if we find the peace of Jesus then we live a life that shares that "Peace" with others. A peace that does not deny the anger etc. but does not let it rule our lives. Grace is to know that as we seek to love God with all our heart, soul and mind, God's love is freely given to us. We cannot earn God's love but we live out of that love. That is true grace that gives peace and moves us to live lives that are filled with justice, forgiveness and hope. Any morning that begins with God's Peace, Grace and Love then is a Good Morning and situates our lives looking in the right direction.

The prophetic tasks of the church is to tell the truth in a society that lives in illusion, grieve in a society that practices denial, and express hope in a society that lives in despair. Walter Brueggemann (UCC Biblical Scholar)

Dry goods (boxed): Au Gratin Potatoes, Scallop Potatoes or any kind of potatoes in a box.


What am I doing here? I've been asking myself that question every day? I know what I am not and that is important part of knowing who you are. I am not your full time residential pastor who plans on staying here many years. I am not an interim pastor who evaluates a church and makes structural changes if needed as a full time position. I am your pastor emeritus, which is a great honor after serving as your residential pastor for 19 years. However, a pastor emeritus is suppose to stay out of the life of the church and out of the way of current pastor. Obviously in my current position I am active in the life of the church. So, what am I doing here as a Transitional Pastor? Here is what I see myself doing. First, I am a place holder simply holding the spot that will be filled with your next pastor. There will be no major planning or programming. That will stay the same.

Right now I see myself as a story teller. You may notice in my sermons I have a long term plan. It is my hope that at the end my ministry here you will have a chance as a congregation to take a deep dive into who we have been historically, where we are now, and what our broad future as Christians looks like. What is the purpose of our individual lives, our corporate lives and our lives as human beings.

It is my hope and prayer that our worship life together aids in that goal and the discussions/classes give us a chance to make our common journey clear. What does God O Mortal Require of us? The age old question of the prophet Micah. To that end we will have a two session discussion on what the "Christian Response" to the Covid-19 crisis should be. We will use N. T. Wrights book *God and the Pandemic* as a guide. Then we will look to see what it means to be a Spiritual Person in the 21st Century. Finally, will look at what Christianity is NOT and will use the work of theologian Douglas Hall to help guide our discussion. It will not be necessary to purchase or read the books to participate in the dialogue. If you are interested in any of these please let me or Kristi in the church office know. We will start in early November and pause Thanksgiving to the New Year. This opportunities will be offered in person, using social distancing and by Zoom. The reason I am waiting to November is to try and learn how to host Zoom sessions.


